Helping Hands Emergency Assistance - Herndon, FAITH helps people regardless of their religion or faith. Assistance may be available and qualified applicants can receive free food, new or discounted clothing and temporary cash grants and financial assistance to qualified families and individuals. Cornerstones / Reston Interfaith is a community action type agency for northern Virginia and Fairfax County. They offer a wide range of self-sufficiency, emergency financial assistance programs, and referrals. Some of the major resources include the following. In some cases, the non-profit may issues loans as a form of emergency assistance.

- ESSP Emergency and Self-Sufficiency Services Program can help with housing needs.
 This may include rent, funds for utility bills, security deposit assistance and other crisis aid.
- Free food is available from a pantry.
- Christmas assistance, such as free gifts for children and meals, is offered along with back to school supplies.
- Child care and vouchers from the Laurel Learning Center.
- Self-sufficiency services from Cornerstone includes ESL classes, credit counseling, and financial literacy, among many others.
- Budgeting and financial literacy is coordinated too. One free class workshop is on making a passive income for free.

If you have no other options, and have already accessed all available assistance programs, then The *Lorton Community Action Center* may be your last option. This agency provides emergency financial aid when all other resources and services have been exhausted. In addition,

Our Daily Bread Inc. - The non-profit can provide qualified families and individuals with a one-time cash grant of up to \$350. The grants are intended to provide an emergency payment toward paying for housing expenses, utilities and energy bills, prescriptions or medical assistance, and/or auto repairs. Fairfax Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) - The federal government stimulus program created a service known as the *Homelessness Prevention Fund*. Section 8 vouchers are also offered by the Department of Family Services (DFS). This is for the elderly, single moms, and very low income. HCV offers rental assistance to subsidize housing payments so people can live in decent, safe, and sanitary housing.
